(Qualifying Major for Bachelor of Arts with the degree of Bachelor of Laws)

The study of English literature extends skills in thinking, analysis, and writing, and develops your understanding of the complex relationship between books and culture. A major in English fosters analytic and creative thought via a focus on the language and ideas of a wide range of engaging texts. It sharpens language use through a consideration of how texts invite particular meanings. Skills in research and critical integration are developed through the study of the contexts and reception of literary texts. In this way, the study of English literature both promotes an informed, global, cross-cultural perspective of the world, and develops communication and research skills that will enhance employment prospects in any industry.
