(Qualifying Major for Bachelor of Arts with the degree of Bachelor of Laws)

Political economy and social policy draws upon economics, sociology and politics to explain and understand how policy, society and the economy develop. This unique interdisciplinary approach allows students to more deeply understand the relationships between economic, social and political issues. The major also has an applied focus, allowing students to connect their knowledge to policy making and social research. This provides an ideal introduction to a range of jobs in policy, administration, research, advocacy and the non-government sectors.

- Please note you should enrol in LAW109, LAWS104 and LAWS108 in 2020.
- Consider what units you will want to study in second and third year. Prerequisite requirements for those units must be completed prior to enrolment in the higher-level unit.
- You must complete a Professional and Community Engagement (PACE) unit with a LAWS prefix as part of your degree. Plan ahead by viewing eligible units with a LAWS prefix at www.handbook.mq.edu.au/2019/Units/PACE.
