

2019 MAJOR – Counselling Theory and Principles

(Qualifying Major for Bachelor of Arts - Psychology with the degree of Bachelor of Human Sciences)

This major will enhance students' understanding of contemporary approaches to counselling and their applications in the workplace and community. It will provide exposure to current theories of counselling and psychotherapy, with a strong emphasis on evidence-based approaches and ethical practice. Although this major will not qualify students as professional counselors, it will help them to develop the understanding and reflective listening required for working with people who need help in dealing with difficult personal issues. The knowledge and understanding students acquire from this major will assist them in obtaining employment in a diverse range of human and community health and welfare contexts and will complement the Psychology studies from that component of the double degree.
