

# 2019 Bachelor of Ancient History

The program includes the study of early Egypt and the ancient Near East through classical Greece and Rome, Late Antiquity, Judaism and early Christianity, and the medieval and Byzantine periods, across the Silk Roads to ancient China. Students are required to take a unit in archaeology (which incorporates the study of materials in the Museum of Ancient Cultures) and two ancient languages. There are also opportunities to participate in archaeological fieldwork abroad. The objectives of the program are to enhance students' understanding of the history of a wide context of ancient cultures and to provide disciplinary skills for subsequent research.

- You must also meet the general requirements for the degree for which you will qualify.
- It may be possible to satisfy the requirements of your degree by taking a different selection of units in your first session from those suggested above.
- Please note that there are two streams based on interest and direction of study: 'Egypt and the Near East' and 'Greece, Rome, and Late Antiquity'. There is some room to sample units from both streams in your first year.
- Consider what units you will want to study in second and third year. Prerequisite requirements for those units must be completed prior to enrolment in the higher-level unit.
- You must select a Professional and Community Engagement (PACE) unit as part of the elective component of your degree. It is important to plan ahead for this requirement and allocate elective space for your chosen PACE unit.
