

2019 Bachelor of Psychology (Honours)

The Honours degree of Bachelor of Psychology is intended for high-achieving students aiming for a professional career in Psychology. It is a four-year accredited degree in Psychology that requires a high ATAR. However, students can also transfer to this degree from other degrees, such as the Bachelor of Arts – Psychology upon meeting entry requirements. The first three years of this degree are concerned with equipping students with a scientific understanding of the psychological processes that underlie behaviour including perception, cognition, learning, motivation, neuroscience, psychopathology, personality, emotion, developmental psychology and social relationships, as well as training in the analysis of data and research methodologies. Admission to the honours (fourth) year of this program will be determined entirely by academic merit. In this year students will plan and engage in an independent and sustained critical investigation and evaluation of a chosen research topic that will match their strengths and career interests.

Admission to the honours (fifth) year of this program will be determined by academic merit. The honours year commences in semester 1 only and is two semesters in duration. In this year students will plan and engage in an independent and sustained critical investigation and evaluation of a chosen research topic that will match their strengths and career interests.
